May 11 – June 5, 2009**



What is Maymester?

Maymester offers students an opportunity to earn up to six hours of college credit in a compressed, four-week format. Maymester courses are “hybrids” using a combination of face-to-face classes and online learning activities. The instructor will provide specific requirements for the online component. Maymester courses follow a shortened time period for delivery; therefore, students should plan for extra study time to be successful.

What are the benefits of Maymester?

The Maymester format is attractive to students who want to earn credit hours during the summer but do not want to be enrolled for the entire semester. Transient students from senior institutions may select one or two courses to meet LIFE scholarship requirements. Students may choose to enroll in a combination of Maymester classes, eight-week summer classes or the ten-week summer classes at CCTC to create an optimum schedule.

When does Maymester begin?

Maymester begins on Monday, May 11. If you are in a class that meets face-to-face on Monday/Wednesday, you are required to begin attending on Monday, May 11. If you are in a class that meets face-to-face on Tuesday/Thursday, you are required to begin attending on Tuesday, May 12. Drop/add will be May 11 and 12. The last day to withdraw with a “W” is May 27.

What are the attendance requirements for Maymester classes?

Attendance will be a critical component of student success in the Maymester format. Therefore, any student who misses more than 4 class periods—either online and/or face-to-face sessions—will automatically receive a grade of WF. The instructor will define “attendance” in the online portion.

How do I register for Maymester?

Students may begin registering for summer classes on Monday, February 23, 2009. If you are a current CCTC student, check with your advisor to see which courses to take to complete your program of study. Then go into MyCCTC and register for the course or courses as you normally would do. **Students should not register for more than two courses during the Maymester format.** Maymester classes are designated with an “M” section number. Transient students should confirm transferability with their home college prior to registering.

How does Maymester affect financial aid?

The Maymester classes are considered part of the summer term; therefore, they will be used in the calculation of your financial aid for summer semester.
